The digital exam questions will be written in a way that calculator use will not be an advantage to students.</li> <li>• On the digital exam, students will answer free-response questions typed on a keyboard, rather than by hand. Digital exams will not require any graph drawing. These skills will be assessed with questions about given diagrams.</li> </ul>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Biology</li> </ul>	<p><b>WHERE &amp; HOW?</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Administered in person, at school in Administration 1, and at home or in school in Administrations 2 and 3.</li> <li>• Offered in a paper-and-pencil traditional format in Administration 1, and in a digital, computer-based format in Administrations 2 and 3.</li> </ul> <p><b>DIFFERENCES</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• On the digital exam, students will answer free-response questions with a keyboard, rather than by hand. Digital exams will not require any graph or diagram drawing. These skills will be assessed with questions about given diagrams.</li> </ul>

Students will be required to answer all of these questions.</li> </ul> </li> <li>♦ <b>Section 2B</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Instead of an LEQ, students will be given two SAQs: 1 data set source, and 1 secondary source text. Students will be required to answer both questions.</li> </ul> </li> </ul> </li> </ul>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Calculus AB</li> <li>• Calculus BC</li> </ul>	<p><b>WHERE &amp; HOW?</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Administered in person, at school in Administrations 1 and 2, and at home or in school in Administration 3.</li> <li>• Offered in a paper-and-pencil traditional format in Administrations 1 and 2, and in a digital, computer-based format in Administration 3.</li> </ul> <p><b>DIFFERENCES</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• On non-calculator sections, the digital exam questions will be written in a way that calculator use will not be an advantage to students.</li> <li>• On the digital exam, free-response questions will be adapted to include answers that can be easily typed with a computer keyboard and will not require complex mathematical expressions or drawing graphs. The digital exam platform will include any symbols needed to type responses.</li> </ul>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Chemistry</li> </ul> 	<p><b>WHERE &amp; HOW?</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Administered in person, at school in Administrations 1 and 2, and at home or in school in Administration 3.</li> <li>• Offered in a paper-and-pencil traditional format in Administrations 1 and 2, and in a digital, computer-based format in Administration 3.</li> </ul> <p><b>DIFFERENCES</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Section 1 of the digital exams will not include questions for which a calculator would be of advantage to students.</li> <li>• The digital exam will have more multiple-choice questions than the paper exams. The digital exams will have a second, 60-minute multiple-choice section with 40 questions.</li> <li>• The free-response section of the digital exams will have fewer questions than the paper exams. On the digital exam, students will have 45 minutes to answer 2 short questions and 1 long question.</li> <li>• On the digital exams, free-response questions will be adapted to include answers that can be easily typed with a computer keyboard; the digital exam platform will include any symbols needed to type responses.</li> </ul>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Physics 1*</li> <li>• Physics 2</li> </ul>	<p><b>WHERE &amp; HOW?</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Administered in person, at school in Administrations 1 and 2, and at home or in school in Administration 3.</li> <li>• Offered in a paper-and-pen traditional format in Administrations 1 and 2, and in a digital, computer-based format in Administration 3.</li> </ul> <p><b>DIFFERENCES</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The digital exams will have more multiple-choice questions than the paper exams. The digital exams will have a second, 45-minute multiple-choice section with 25 questions.</li> <li>• The free-response section of the digital exams will have fewer questions than the paper exams. On the digital exams, students will have 45 minutes to answer questions: a <b>Qualitative/Quantitative Transition</b>, and a <b>Short Answer: Paragraph Argument</b>.</li> </ul>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Physics C: Electricity &amp; Magnetism</li> <li>• Physics C: Mechanics</li> </ul>	<p><b>WHERE &amp; HOW?</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Administered in person, at school in Administrations 1 and 2, and at home or in school in Administration 3.</li> <li>• Offered in a paper-and-pencil traditional format in Administrations 1 and 2, and in a digital, computer-based format in Administration 3.</li> </ul> <p><b>DIFFERENCES</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The digital exams will have no free-response sections. Instead, they will consist of 2 multiple-choice sections, each lasting 45 minutes with 35 questions each.</li> </ul>

\*Every 2021 AP Exam will test students on the full curriculum of their course, except for the Physics 1 exam, which will only cover Units 1-7 for both the paper and digital exams.
